2006 ALPA Photo Contest: "Faces of ALPA"

The celebration will feature plenty of memories, and every one of them will honor those people who have manifested dedication and grit—from Dave Behncke and his band of pioneering organizers to the pilot volunteers of today who devote so many hours to keeping ALPA strong and resolute and on the leading edge of effective labor advocacy.

ALPA is not only about its history—ALPA is about surviving the present and building for the future. ALPA is about the dedicated men and women who continue to carry the banner of safety, fair representation, and community involvement—the pilots who make a difference.

The 2006 ALPA Photo Contest is dedicated to those people who make this union what it is. We want photos of your fellow pilots who have had a strong effect—on aviation, on the union, on safety, on their community. We want to see your coworkers in action—in and around the airplanes, the airports, the crewroom, their hometown. We want to see the pilots who personify ALPA, and we want you to tell us why this pilot is extraordinary.

You may submit photos taken expressly for this contest or ones from any ALPA era if they otherwise fit the requirements of the competition.

General rules

Images will be judged on overall photographic and artistic quality, as well

as the story behind the picture. A panel of judges will select those entries that best represent the "Faces of ALPA," to be featured in the June/July issue of this magazine. Their decisions on all matters relating to this contest are final.

Contestants are limited to 10 photos each, and no photograph that has previously been published may be entered.

Only entries submitted by the contest deadline of April 30 will be accepted for the contest.

This contest has no entry fee.

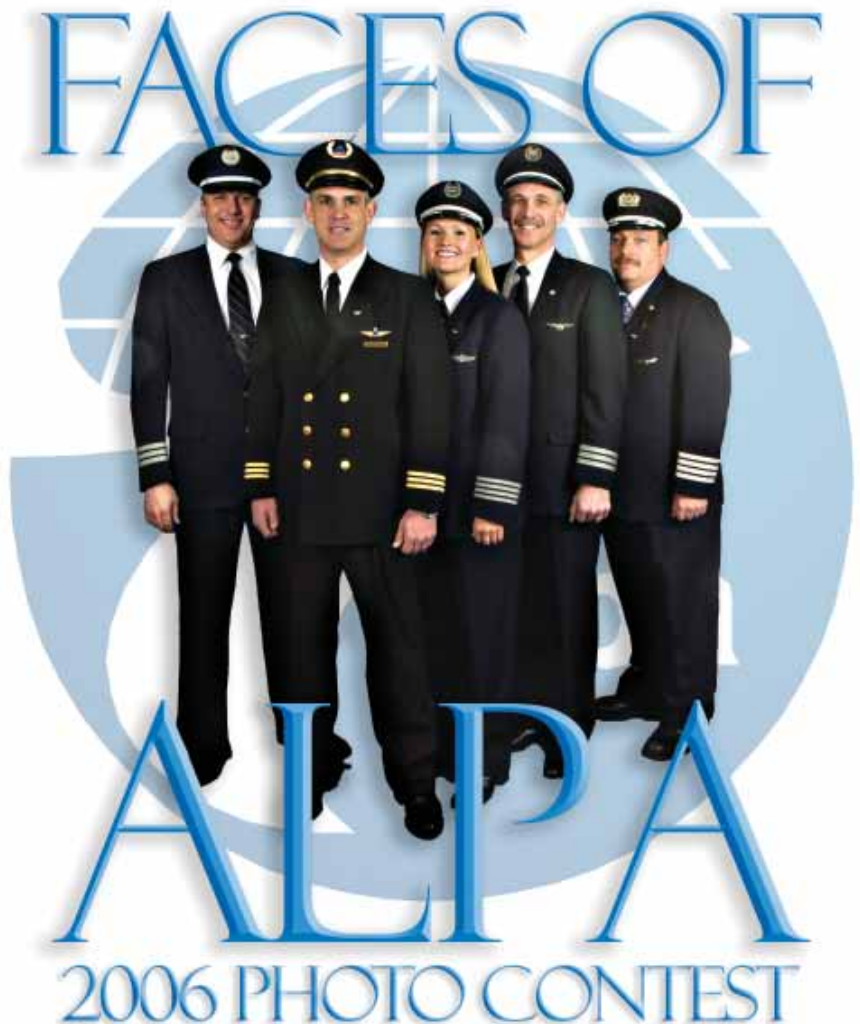
Preparation of entries

The photographs may be submitted as

- Digital images (.jpg, .jpeg, or .tif, in PC format), which should be in the highest possible resolution (266–300 dpi) and sent on a CD, or
- Prints, minimum size 3" x 5" (larger is preferred).

Please include the following information with each photo:

- File name (for electronic submissions)
- Subject or topic, including the name(s) of people who appear in the photo



- A paragraph of no more than 100 words about why this pilot has made a difference in aviation, in safety, and/or in the community
 - Name of photographer, with contact information, such as phone numbers and postal and e-mail addresses
 - Date the photo was taken
 - Where the photo was taken
 - Camera make and model
- Photos may not be combined or manipulated using photo-enhancement software.

Reproduction rights

Photo prints and digital images must be accompanied by a signed release

from the copyright-holding authority giving ALPA limited reproduction rights. Photos submitted to the 2006 photo contest may be used for ALPA publications without payment to the photographer.

Submission of entries

Entries must be postmarked by April 28. All entries become the property of ALPA and will not be returned. Please do not send your only copy of a photograph.

Winners

Each winning entry will earn a prize of \$100. Contest winners will be announced in the June/July issue of *Air Line Pilot* and will be notified by mail and e-mail. If the winners do not respond to our notification and claim the prize within 90 days, the prize may be forfeited. Winners are responsible for all applicable federal, state, or local taxes.
